63 Graduates Celebrate 5th COM Commencement Exercises

The AUP College of Medicine celebrated its 5th commencement exercises with 63 graduates from Sinagtala Class of 2023, the largest number of graduates ever for the College, on June 23-25, 2023.

AUP Enrollment Increases by 9% in Inter-semester 2023

nrollment figures for the Inter-semester 2023 at the Adventist University of the Philippines had a 9%

increase compared with the previous year,

with a total of 1,846 officially enrolled undergraduate students. Six out of eight colleges that offer undergraduate programs experienced an increase in enrollment. The College of Dentistry took the lead with a 30% increase in enrolment after welcoming a total of 241 students. Other colleges that noted an enrollment increase of 9%, 3%, 18%, 15%, and 7% respectively are the College of Business (289), College of Health (443), College of Nursing (441), College of Science and

Technology (77), and College of Theology (29).


AUP Passes CPALE 2023

ight accountancy graduates from the Adventist University of the Philippines-College of Business passed the recent Certified Public Accountant Licensure Examination held last May 2023. The University achieved a 72.73% overall passing rate against the 30.35% national passing rate.

The new Certified Public Accountants are Anillo, Meliz Joy; Ferrera, Charmaine; Formoles, Merelle Rose; Ghisellini, Gabriele; Maniquis, Ronna Mia; Paragas, Aira Ruzzelle; Parcon, Pearlen Zia; and Soriano, April Mae. Some of them testified about the significance of their field. "For me, a CPA means being a guardian of public interest," Aira Ruzzelle Paragas, testified. "In this world of unfairness and corruption, I would like to shed light on integrity. I want to start my ministry in this field. I may not do much as a newbie in this profession, but I want to do everything possible to help God's plan," Paragas continued.

Ronna Mia Maniquis, another CPALE passer also shared her thoughts on what it means to become a CPA. "It is a realization that I have a greater responsibility to fulfill and now I am excited about what I can do and learn in the profession."





AUP CON Ranks 6 in NLE

The Adventist University of the Philippines-College of Nursing placed 6th among the top performing schools in the Philippines with a 97.01% overall performance against the 74.93% national passing rate during the May 2023 Nurse Licensure Examination released on Jun 10, 2023.

Among the 67 takers, 65 passed which resulted in a 98.25% passing rate for first-time takers. In gratitude for this accomplishment, some of the newly registered nurses shared their testimonies how passing the exam impacted them. "It was God all along," Roanne May Garlitos remarked as she shared how God led her to nursing. She experienced anxiety attacks and feared the unknown but "God's plan took over." She also mentioned the support of her CON family and AUP from the beginning. She concluded her testimony with an encouragement to "dream with God."

Savina Thalitha Cumi Ferry shared how the road to success came with fear and uncertainty, but God revealed His plans to her. "All I can share is that God never fails me and has always shown me the light, even in my darkest days. The God who helped me survive my college days is the same God who helped me pass the board exam," she testified.

Indeed, the journey brought changes the nurses' life. "We praise God for everything He has done for us," Harvey Bermudez expressed how grateful this milestone in his career brought him closer to God. He wished to continue to strengthen his spiritual journey and relationship with God "beyond the NLE and unto our mission fields in the nursing career."

Hector Emmanuel Gayares imparted two key points about the board exam: faith and perseverance. "Faith, because no amount of studying will ever prepare you for all the questions you will face. That's just how broad the exam is. Therefore, a faith that God will supply knowledge is important. Imagine 500 questions from the different areas of nursing practice. It is physically impossible to study for it all. Perseverance, because again faith without work is dead," he concluded.

AUP Inaugurates New X-ray and Ultrasound Machines for the Health Service Department

The Health Service Department acquired and inaugurated new X-ray and ultrasound machines on June 27, 2023.

Taking part in the ribbon cutting were Dr. Prudencio Sta. Lucia, AUP Health Service medical director; Dr. Arceli Rosario, AUP president; Dr. Robert Borromeo, vice president for finance; and Dr. Julio Amurao, vice president for student services.

Dr. George Abarro, AUP Health Service radiologist, explained that the newly-acquired Shimadzu direct radiology filmless X-ray and ultrasound machines "will help doctors manage and correlate with other ancillary procedures [which] would be a great adjunct with the initial diagnosis for proper management and treatment of patients." He added that "this technology will hasten the interpretation of X-ray images and through teleradiology, results will be presented faster."

These two machines are part of realizing the University's "dream of [having] a teaching hospital." As part of its mission to provide whole-person care and healing, "this purchase is in line with the dream," Dr. Rosario pointed out.
