The Adventist University of the Philippines was honored with three prestigious awards during the 2023 Commission on Higher Education Regional Office IV CALABARZON Internationalization Awards Night. The ceremony took place at De La Salle Lipa gymnasium on December 14, 2023 and was attended by presidents,

vice presidents, and representatives of higher education institutions.

In recognition of the exceptional commitment to holistic development through extension and outreach programs, fostering collaboration among international institutions, the University received three

prestigious awards: Top 1 Performing HEI in Internationalization for Community Extension, Theological Accreditation Award, and Medal of Distinction Lifelong Medical Missionary Service Award.

These accolades recognized AUP's unwavering support for the internationalization of Philippine higher education through exemplary initiatives and accomplishments on national and international fronts.

ifty-three College of Education graduates passed the the September 2023 Licensure Exam for Professional Teachers. The results were released by the Professional Regulatory Commission on December 7, 2023.


For the elementary level, 11 takers passed, achieving a 90.91% passing rate for first-time takers and 91.67% overall performance against the 47.01% national passing rate.

For the secondary level, 42 takers passed, exhibiting a 90.48% passing rate for first-time takers and 76.36% overall performance against the 56.27% national passing rate.
