## AUP Shifts to June-March Academic Calendar

The Adventist University of the Philippines (AUP) has officially transitioned its academic calendar from August–May to the previous schedule of June–March. This change, announced today with the release of the University-wide academic calendar, will take effect starting Academic Year (AY) 2025–2026 and applies to all levels: elementary, academy, and tertiary.

The transition aligns with the Department of Education's (DepEd) nationwide directive reinstating the June–March school year, formalized in Department Order No. 012, s. 2025. Although the directive primarily addresses public schools, private institutions such as AUP are granted the option to follow suit under the School Calendar Law (Republic Act No. 7797).

The decision is a timely response to public concern over the health and safety risks posed by intensifying heat during the dry season. On April 29, 2024, former Senate President Juan Miguel Zubiri released a statement urging both DepEd and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) to shift the academic calendar back to its traditional cycle to safeguard students and educators from extreme summer temperatures.

# AUP Annual Mass Blood Donation Collect 364 Blood Bags for Life-Saving Mission

The Adventist University of the Philippines lived up to its mission of nurturing Christ-centered, service-oriented students through its annual Mass Blood Donation held on April 6, 2025, at the Medical Laboratory Science Center. Led by the AUP Biology Department and Medical Laboratory Science (MLS) Department, the event collected an impressive 364 bags of blood—a testament to the continued dedication of the University community to health, compassion, and service.



This initiative, rooted in Adventist values of holistic education and selfless service, was done in collaboration with the Philippine Red Cross Silang-Pasay Chapter and the Adventist Medical Center-Manila. As a yearly tradition dating back to 2011, the Mass Blood Donation has become one of the University's flagship service activities, consistently mobilizing medical and allied health students and faculty alike to meet the urgent needs of patients in local hospitals.

This long-standing project has previously earned the University the "Gabriela Silang Award" from the Department of Health from 2020-2024 recognizing its vital contribution to public health and community outreach. Last July 2024, the University again received

the award for conducting mobile blood donation activities with accumulated collection of 100-199 blood units.

Through events like this, AUP reinforces the core Adventist belief in the healing ministry of Jesus, calling every student to serve "the least of these" (Matthew 25:40) with both skill and compassion.



# PALMED 2025 Kicks-Off at AUP

Over 1,200 medical students and guest delegates from 18 medical schools in the National Capital Region and South Luzon gathered Palarong Medisina 2025. The event took place at the Adventist University of the Philippines, Silang, Cavite, on April 6 and 9, 2025.

AUP College of Medicine (AUP-COM) was selected to host the annual sporting event this year, with students from the medical colleges of vAMA, Ateneo School of Medicine and Public Health, Chinese General Hospital Colleges, De La Salle Medical Health Sciences Institute, Far Eastern University - Dr. Nicanor Reyes Medical Foundation (FEU-NRMF), Metropolitan Medical Center, Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Maynila, San Beda University, St. Luke's Medical Center College of Medicine, University of Perpetual Help Rizal-Jonelta, University of Santo Tomas, University of the East and the University of the Philippines being sent to compete in the two-day athletic contest.



their respective schools. Dr. Lemuel Dee Berto, AUP-COM faculty, delivered the opening remarks to welcome the delegates and to formally commence the event, followed by the opening program and recognition of participating schools this year.

Notably, AUP men's football team currently holds the third place with 2 wins, 1 tie and two losses, with dominant victories over St. Luke's and FEU-NRMF.



"The hardest [challenge] is that we were only given 3 weeks to prepare," Salpak Head Kayla Nicole Duremdes of the AUP College of Medicine stated. "We don't even know if people are willing [to participate] knowing that in AUP-COM, we have less than most medical schools do.... But in that hardship and challenge, you could really see God moving. You could really see that it was God showing us that, 'There is nothing impossible if you trust in me.' God uses lots of things, even [Palarong Medisina], to use us as His ministry, and that is the most rewarding."

Medical student athletes competed in different sporting events including basketball, volleyball, badminton, ultimate frisbee, and table tennis to showcase their skills beyond the academic setup within

# AUP Shines Again in Board Exam Triumphs this April 2025

The University stood in gratitude and celebration as it shone, by God's grace, in three major licensure examinations in April 2025. More than a display of academic strength, these milestones testified to the faith, perseverance, and divine guidance that anchored AUP's commitment to nurturing competent, Christ-centered professionals.



## 100% Passing Rate for Medical Technologist Board Exam

AUP's Medical Laboratory Science program achieved an impressive 100% passing rate in the March 2025 Medical Technologist Licensure Examination, with all 28 examinees passing. This outstanding result exceeded the national passing rate of 80.26%, highlighting the students' dedication and the department's commitment to excellence.



## Results for Electronics Engineering Board Exam

The Department of Electronics Communication Engineering (ECE) also made its mark in the April 2025 Electronics Engineering Licensure Examination (ECELE) and Electronics Technician Licensure Examinations (ECTLE). Out of 1,280 passers, four AUP ECE graduates passed the ECELE. Moreover, the University achieved a 90% passing rate for the ECTLE, significantly surpassing the national average of 81.75%.



## Empowering Physician Missionaries in the Physician Licensure Exam

AUP's College of Medicine empowered more physician missionaries in the March–April 2025 Physician Licensure Examination (PLE), achieving a 70.53% passing rate for first-time takers and an overall performance of 63.64%, surpassing the national average of 49.67%. Last October 2024 PLE, COM also achieved a 66.67% for first-time takers and an overall passing rate of 70.18%, higher than the 58.27% national average.

These shining blessings remind us that true success is rooted not only in preparation and knowledge but also in the faithfulness of a limitless God who leads every step of the journey. As AUP continues to cultivate excellence in various fields, the University gives back all the glory to God—our Master Teacher and Healer.

## 100% Passing Rate in TESDA Caregiving NC II Exam

Caregiving NC II National Assessment Examination administered by TESDA on March 7, March 14, and April 11, 2025, achieved a 100% passing rate. The achievement reinforced AUP-CON's role in preparing competent and compassionate caregivers ready to serve both locally and globally.

# COM Clinical Clerks Begin Clinical Rotation at Loma Linda University Health

Eight clinical clerks from Altum Septima 2025, the graduating class of the Adventist University of the Philippines-College of Medicine, have officially begun their six-week clinical rotation at Loma Linda University Health (LLUH) in California, USA. This enriching rotation, running from April 20 to May 25, 2025, is part of an annual exchange initiative between AUP and its esteemed sister institution, the Loma Linda University School of Medicine (LLUSM).

Carefully selected through a competitive and rigorous process, these clinical clerks were chosen for their embodiment of AUPCOM's five-star plus physician model—demonstrating not only academic excellence, but also a strong commitment to integrity, service, and whole-person care.

This international rotation offers AUP students a unique opportunity to broaden their clinical experience and deepen their medical insight within a globally recognized healthcare environment. Under the mentorship of expert clinicians at LLUH, the clerks will engage in patient care and medical team collaboration, further equipping them for compassionate, Christ-centered medical service.

The collaboration between AUP and LLUH stands as a testament to their shared vision of nurturing healthcare professionals who integrate faith, knowledge, and healing. This partnership continues to open doors for Filipino medical students to experience high standards of care and education in a Seventh-day Adventist institution overseas.



## CES Reaches Out to Fire Victims in Inchican with Urgent Relief Aid

In the spirit of service and compassion, the University extended timely relief efforts to victims of a devastating fire that struck Barangay Inchican on the evening of April 19, 2025. The tragedy left 51 families — totaling 215 individuals — homeless after 38 houses were completely razed, according to the Bureau of Fire Protection.



Mobilized through University Community Extension Services (CES), the initiative gathered faculty, staff, and students who came together to provide essential relief items to the affected families just two days after the incident on April 21, 2025. The initiative was a tangible expression of the University's mission to be a beacon of hope and service to the community.

Each of the 51 families received a thoughtfully curated set of 13 basic household items, tailored to support their immediate hygiene and dignity needs. The donated items included a pail with cover, plastic cups, cutlery, arinola (chamber pot), bar soap, hangers, tabo (dipper), basin, towel, adult briefs, and assorted undergarments for adults, children, and babies (as applicable). The total value of goods distributed amounted to PHP61,684.50.

"The goal was not just to give supplies, but to show these families that they are not alone in this difficult time," said one CES volunteer. "We hope that this small act of kindness helps lighten their burden, even for a moment."

To ensure an organized and respectful distribution, representatives from each family were guided through 13 stations, where they received one item at a time with dignity and care. The fire relief operation reflects AUP's ongoing commitment to community service — not just as a response to tragedy, but as a demonstration of Christian compassion and collective responsibility.



## AUP Hosts 7th International Research Forum with Global Participation

The Adventist University of the Philippines continued to take strides in advancing academic scholarship with the successful staging of its 7th International Research Forum, held under the theme “Bridging Mind: Expanding Horizon” via Zoom on April 24, 2025. Organized by the AUP Research Office, the forum highlighted commitment to fostering a global research culture that bridged knowledge and innovation across disciplines.

This year’s forum featured 95 research paper presentations from diverse academic fields. A total of 120 participants registered, and 168 individuals joined online, demonstrating wide-reaching engagement both locally and internationally.

The forum was graced by two esteemed keynote speakers: Dr. June Bryan Dela Peña, assistant professor in the Department of Anesthesiology and Critical Care Medicine, School of Medicine, University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center, Albuquerque, USA and Dr. Crisamar Javellana Anunciado, FNP–BC, BC-ADM, a senior medical science liaison and nurse practitioner from Chula Vista, California.

Both speakers inspired the audience with insights on interdisciplinary research and the evolving landscape of global healthcare and science. Feedback from the forum was overwhelmingly positive, with evaluation results averaging 3.90 out of 4.0, rated “Excellent.” Participants lauded the quality of presentations, the relevance of topics, and the smooth execution of the event.

The forum served not only as a platform for knowledge dissemination but also as a vital space for collaboration, professional growth, and academic excellence. As AUP continued to nurture a research-oriented academic environment, events like these marked significant milestones in its mission to be a center of excellence in Christian education.



## AUP Elementary Joins Friendship Games at Lipa

Eighty-six students from Adventist University of the Philippines Elementary (AUPE), Lipa Adventist Academy (LAA) Elementary, and Rosario Adventist Elementary School (RAES) came together for a day filled with fellowship, fun, and faith at the Friendship Games 2025, held at Lipa Adventist Academy on March 16, 2025.

The event focused on the value of friendship, especially in times of challenge. The games served not only as a platform for friendly competition but also as an avenue to strengthen ties among Adventist elementary schools. Pastor Lyndon Mar Catolico, chaplain of LAA, opened the day with a short devotional. Drawing from the verse of Proverbs 17:17, Pastor Catolico reminded everyone that true friendship mirrors the love of God, emphasizing that real friends uplift each other during difficult times.

Highlights of the day were the sport events. The students enthusiastically participated in various sports events including volleyball (boys and girls), basketball, and badminton (singles, doubles, mixed).

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## 1st Kintsugi Chaplaincy Summit Held at AUP

The Kintsugi Summit 2025, a trauma-informed pastoral care and chaplaincy event, brought 128 attendees together: clergy, pastors, seminary students, chaplains, and care practitioners for a day of healing-centered dialogue and training from Adventist Medical Center–Manila (AMCM), AUP Academy, AUP Student Services Office, AUP College of Theology, Cavite Mission, Community Care Chaplains, Central Luzon Conference, Central Luzon Provinces Mission, and South Central Luzon Conference. Organized by the Spiritual Development Office in partnership with the Guidance Services and the College of Theology, the first Kintsugi Summit was held at AUP Finster Hall of All Nations on April 23, 2025. The keynote speaker was Pastor Geoffrey Tio, Director of Mission and Spiritual Care at Adventist Health, Northern California, USA.

The event was also supported by the Kintsugi Resilience Philippines team: Mags Tio, Pastor Ronald Yabut, Jennevie Yabut, Pastor Erwin Pajares, Dr. Addie Jackson, and Mrs. Vanessa Lewis Williams. The summit emphasized the integration of trauma-informed approaches into spiritual care, fostering resilience, and building compassionate ministry communities.

"[I learned about] the timeless truths about human brokenness which it can be restored despite all of these scars that maybe left in the person due to the experiences of pain and all, in the past experiences. I hope that the ministry will come and many more will be blessed," Pastor Jay Fajardo, AMCM head chaplain, shared.



Pastor Tio further shared that Kintsugi Resilience is for people who are going through times of crisis in life. "We are finally giving this to the community for you guys to have a sacred space where you can find healing [in God]."

Another pastor from Central Luzon Conference shared who "there are spaces in my life that God's grace can flourish." And his role of being a shepherd is significantly emphasized in the summit that "walking with my members and not just me teaching them biblical truth" but go through that journey together with God and to God.

In addition to the summit, the Kintsugi team also led the devotional worship for the University Administrative Committee, dedicating the leaders to service through faith and prayer.

## COT Urges Future Pastors to Embrace Mission and Unity during Commission and Dedication Service

The College of Theology (COT) of the Adventist University of the Philippines (AUP) held its Commission and Dedication Ceremony at the Philippine International Church (PIC) on April 30, 2025, anchoring on “Called to Serve: Ministry and Mission.”

The event served as a formal act of sending graduating theology students into the mission field, affirming their calling to pastoral ministry and preparing them to serve as gospel workers in various communities.

The service featured the commissioning of 20 senior theology students, the dedication of 15 third-year students, and 6 senior students who will continue their training in the upcoming school year. Junior students stood as witnesses to the ceremony, symbolizing their support and readiness for their own commissioning next year.

In his keynote address, Pastor Adriel Gavenia, Ministerial Secretary of the Southern Luzon Philippine Union Mission, reminded the future pastors of their divine calling by presenting four key points: understanding the mission, receiving divine empowerment, being sent to witness, and serving in unity and faith. “Embrace your calling, trust in the Holy Spirit, be bold witnesses, and cultivate unity through prayer. May this commissioning not only mark the beginning of your ministries but also ignite a lasting passion for the mission that God has set before you and the Church,” he said.

Pastor Lowell Domocmat, Dean of the College of Theology, explained that the commissioning is a significant milestone that recognizes the readiness of senior students to enter the pastoral field. “We are commissioning them to go into the field and spread the gospel, particularly within the context of the Three Angels’ Messages,” he shared. He added that the juniors’ presence as witnesses symbolizes their preparation for future service.

“Remain faithful to the calling you believe God has placed upon your lives,” Pastor Domocmat encouraged. “As you go out to serve and spread the gospel, remember that when you are faithful to the Lord, He will remain faithful to you in your ministry.”

Alfredo Fabores, one of the senior theology students, reflected on the significance of the ceremony. “The pinning and commissioning reminded me to take my preparation seriously, as greater responsibilities await in the field. It inspired me to strengthen my faith, sharpen my skills, and fully dedicate myself to God’s calling—not as a career, but as a sacred trust,” he said.

The ceremony concluded with a charge to the students to remain steadfast in their mission, empowered by faith, and united in purpose as they step into full-time ministry.



# AUP-COM Celebrates National Award Achievements for 2025

The Adventist University of the Philippines-College of Medicine recently celebrated the remarkable achievements of its alumnus and faculty member, Dr. Jon Sergei Aclan, alongside student Kevin De Jesus.

## Aclan Honored as Ten Outstanding Students of the Philippines 2025

Dr. Aclan was recognized as one of the 30 National Honorees for the 58th Ten Outstanding Students of the Philippines (TOSP) and ranked among the Top 10 awardees representing CALABARZON-NCR at the awards ceremony held in Mandaluyong City on April 27, 2025.



Dr. Aclan, a Doctor of Medicine graduate from AUP-COM, exemplifies the ideals of academic excellence, social responsibility, and servant leadership, which are central to the TOSP legacy. He was not only a Top 10 finalist for CALABARZON-NCR but also earned a place among the National Top 30. Known for founding Project GiFTED and serving as both the founding president of the AUP Medicine Student Council and the national chairperson of the APMC-SN Medical Education Committee, Dr. Aclan's commitment to education and community impact is significant. He has also been recognized as a podium presenter at the 3rd Institutional Research Conference and a grant winner in the 2017 Angat Buhay Grant Competition.

The 58th TOSP batch marks a historic revival of recognizing young leaders, academics, and service-oriented individuals after a delay

due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During the ceremony, which also commemorated the first death anniversary of TOSP founder Mr. Jose S. Concepcion Jr., Dr. Aclan stated, "Community service is more than just giving money or volunteering in community projects. It is about uplifting people's lives and providing them with the means to navigate life's challenges while serving as an inspiration to others."
